Why take a course in Italian language?

How and where to learn?

You will learn Italian taught by a team of qualified and experienced Italian teachers. The courses are designed on the basis of the Common European Framework. You will learn in lessons offering contexts that involve students, meaning your participation is essential. How to get your credits?

The semester course corresponds to 6 ECTS which home universities will recognize. ATTENDANCE IS MANDATORY, Students WILL NEED TO ATTEND A MINIMUM OF 75% OF THE COURSE TO BE ALLOWED TO TAKE THE FINAL EXAM. Università Cattolica only provides students with an attendance certificate, which is issued, when the final examination is considered a "pass" (minimum score of 18/30). The examination contains a written and oral section to check learning outcomes.

Students will be given all necessary information about the exams during the course.

The final exams may only be taken on the day and at the time scheduled in the programme.

How will you be assigned to the right course/level?

- You will be asked to take an on-line placement test, which will give us specific information about your general competence in Italian.
- You will then be assigned to the appropriate class/level, which could be different from your expectation/self-evaluation.

SEMESTER COURSE

The semester course is organized to go along with the first and second semester calendar of the academic year for a total of 44 units worth a total of 6 ECTS credits. Classes are dynamic and interactive as the emphasis is on spoken communication, which is achieved through lots of group work and role-plays.
