

The following requirements are based on the guidelines for admission published every year by the Italian Ministry for Universities and Research.

You must hold a high school qualification conferred **after a minimum of 12 years** of previous global schooling and achieved **after at least 2 years of attendance within the same national education system**.

Qualifications obtained after 11 years of global schooling do not allow access to Italian universities, unless you satisfy one of the following additional conditions:

- 1. You attended **one year of university studies and took all the exams** included in the relevant study plan. No transfer of credits can be requested for the university studies.
- 2. You can provide evidence that you attended a **pre-school year** (this usually applies to some Latin American countries). This can be taken into consideration only if its attendance was compulsory, and its syllabus included development of reading and writing skills in the local language.
- 3. You successfully **completed a Foundation Course from an Italian University**. Foundations courses from non-Italian universities are not automatically accepted and their suitability as diploma integration will be evaluated case by case.
