

How the EU pool and the non-EU pool are distinguished

EU candidates

You belong to the EU pool if you fall under any of the following categories:

- You have a passport of one of the countries mentioned below* and you live anywhere around the world; (eg. You have a Spanish passport, and you live in the Philippines)
- You don't have a passport of any of the countries mentioned below* BUT you live in Italy
 and have a valid Permesso di Soggiorno/Residence Permit; (eg. You have a Colombian
 passport, and you live in Italy with a valid residence permit)
- You have more than one passport, for example a non-EU passport AND an EU passport and you live anywhere in the world. The EU passport always takes priority. (eg. You have a Brazilian and a Portuguese passport, you live in Brazil)

NON-EU candidates

You belong to the NON-EU pool if you fall under the following category:

 You don't have a passport of any of the countries mentioned below* and you live anywhere in the world (excluding Italy). (e.g. You have a UK passport, and you live in the UK.) (e.g. You have a Korean passport and you live in Korea.) (e.g. You have a US passport, and you live in France.) (e.g. You have an Indian passport, and you live in the UAE.)

N.B. ALL UK passport holders (with no dual European nationality) are considered as **NON-EU** candidates for admission purposes.
